Reading: 1 Samuel Chapter 17

David, the son of Jesse, was a shepherd boy, who liked nothing better than to look after his father's sheep. He loved all the beautiful things around him and watched the seasons come and go each year. He loved to watch the birds and animals, the moon, the stars and sky; nothing went by unnoticed as he sat among the trees and flowers on the grassy slopes. So great was David's love of beauty that he would sit and sing songs about all the lovely things around him, and of God's goodness to his people. David wrote his own songs, he wrote the Psalms in the Bible.

Three of David's brothers were soldiers in the Kings army. David was too young to fight in King Saul's army so he went on minding his father's sheep. But David longed to be a soldier like his three brothers.

Then one day Jesse, David's father asked him to take food to his brothers and to come back to Jesse to tell him how they were. David wasted no time. He found someone to look after his sheep and set off early the next morning. He reached King Saul's camp just as the two great armies were preparing themselves for the battle. He found his brothers in the front line, near the King. Suddenly there was a silence among the armies. A giant soldier had appeared, his named was Goliath.
