Reading: Luke Chapter 6 verses 13-16

Jesus saw two other men mending their nets, they were called James and John, and Jesus called to them and they immediately left the ship and their father and followed him.

They were all very willing to leave their boats and their families and follow Jesus.

Jesus chose six more disciples and they were Simon, Matthew, Thomas, James, Judas and Judas Iscariot.

Jesus chose these 12 men, called diciples, special followers to help him in his work.
